

AVP in Australia

The Alternatives to Violence Project (AVP) is a network of independent, not-for-profit, volunteer groups. It offers experiential workshops in non-violent problem solving and creative conflict transformation. AVP is used in prisons, schools and the wider community.

These workshops can empower individuals to liberate themselves and others from the burden of violence. The fundamental belief of AVP is that there is a power for peace and good in everyone which has the ability to transform violence. AVP builds upon a spiritual basis of respecting and caring for self and others.

The Alternatives to Violence Project (ACT) is currently offering **Basic** and **Advanced** workshops. All training sessions are non-sectarian. Change and learning come by doing and playing. AVP has serious intent but fun interactions. In doing these workshops participants may expect personally to experience non-violence in action.

A third workshop, **Training for Facilitating**, which will be scheduled shortly, is open to people who have completed the **Basic** and **Advanced** training. This provides a combination of personal development and training for those who may wish with to become volunteer AVP facilitators in a school, community or prison setting. A major but not exclusive aim of the current series of workshops is to provide facilitators to run workshops in the new ACT prison to be opened in 2008.
